

PLEASE TAKE ACTION NOW:
OPPOSE THE NEW BASIS CHARTER SCHOOL IN AUSTIN'S CRESTVIEW NEIGHBORHOOD

Basis Charter Schools (Texas) is an Arizona-based charter chain that currently runs 3 campuses in San Antonio. Basis has asked the Texas Education Agency for approval to open two new campuses in Austin. The first is a K-4 campus to open in August 2020 in the Crestview neighborhood, with plans to open a 5-12 grade campus in 2021. The chosen location for the K – 4 campus is at the site of Crestview Baptist Church (1501 Dartmouth) in Austin.

The decision is expected soon, so please act now.

Here are critical concerns about Basis Charter Schools:

- **There is no need for a new charter school in the Crestview neighborhood. There are already high performing AISD elementary schools near the proposed Basis location.**
Two AISD schools are less than 1 mile from the Basis location: Wooten Elementary is rated **B** on state accountability; and Brentwood Elementary is rated **A**. Five additional AISD elementary schools are less than 2.5 miles away: Reilly Elementary is rated **A**; TA Brown Elementary is rated **C**; Gullett Elementary is rated **B**; Pillow Elementary is rated **C**; and Padron Elementary is rated **B**.
- **Basis does not serve students who are representative of students in this Austin neighborhood.**
Basis serves a significantly disproportionate percentage of certain student populations compared to the percentage served by Austin elementary schools that are near the proposed Basis campus:

Students	Basis Charter Schools in San Antonio	Nearby Austin ISD Schools
Special Education	1.8%	Up to 17.0%
Economically Disadvantaged	5.5%	Up to 97.1%
English Language Learners	14.2%	Up to 82.9%
At-Risk	22.3%	Up to 88.6%

- **Basis charter schools will drain funding from Austin ISD schools and harm all Austin students.**
AISD estimates that the district will lose an estimated \$21.4 million in revenue over ten years if the Basis schools open, and recapture payments will increase by \$2.7 million in year 6 after Basis opens. This loss of revenue to the district will have an impact on all Austin students.
- **Keep taxpayer dollars in Texas.**
Basis is managed by an Arizona-based for-profit charter management organization affiliated with the school's founders which has been paid an estimated \$17.5 million of Texas taxpayer dollars over the last seven years from the 3 schools that Basis currently operates in San Antonio.
- **Texas faces a dire budget situation: All available state funds should be used to support existing public schools meet current challenges and ensure that Texas can keep the promises made in HB 3.**
Rather than paying for a new charter school that isn't needed and hasn't been requested by Austin parents, Texas should focus state dollars where they are needed the most.
